Welcome

We would like to welcome all new parents to the nursery. We hope your children enjoy their time with us and that you feel happy with the care they receive.

Training

Early / Late session

The early session starts at 7.30am. If you come into the nursery before 8.00am we will assume your child is on the early session. The late session starts at 5.30pm. If your child is still in the nursery after 5.30pm we will assume your child is on the late session. The late session finishes at 6.00pm. There is no need to pre-book to use one of these sessions. A small fee will be added to your next monthly payment if you do use one of these sessions.

Children's photographer

We hope you are pleased with your child's photograph. There are a number of options available for you to order and they do make great little Christmas presents. The photographer will be back in nursery for the 'Leaver's Photograph' on Thursday 14th May 2009 and the individual photographs will be taken on Thursday 1st October 2009. Vacancies

There are only very limited vacancies in the nursery at the moment. If you would like to increase your child's attendance or change their days, please see Nicola or Sara as soon as possible.

LEA Grant

Pre-school children aged three and upwards are eligible for a government grant in the term after their third birthday. It is organised by the nursery and just requires your signature on a form. Everyone who is entitled to the grant in the Spring Term will pay reduced fees for a period of 10 weeks starting week commencing Monday 5th January 2009.

Floppy

The Pre-school unit has a new toy dog called Floppy, the same as in the Oxford Reading Tree stories. The children will take it in turns to take Floppy home at weekends. Floppy has a collar, lead, bowl, toys and even his own diary. With help from enthusiastic parents, children can record their adventures with their

cuddly friend, using photographs and souvenirs. The idea is to help children talk about home life and gives them all a shared interest.

Harvest

Pre-school are currently discussing the Jewish New Year, Eid and the Christian Harvest festival. A hamper will be presented by a number of children to a local sheltered accommodation for the elderly. It would be appreciated if anyone would like to bring in an item for the hamper.

Transfer of units

Many children transfer units at this time of year. They have several tasters in their new unit and the vast majority settle in immediately. If you have any concerns please speak to the Head of Unit.

Christmas parties

The children's Christmas parties will take place on Wednesday 17th and Thursday 18th December. Further details will be available nearer the time. Father Christmas will be dropping in!

Christmas closure

As mentioned in February's newsletter, the nursery will be open on Christmas Eve but will close early at 3.00pm. This will give all of our staff a guaranteed early finish and will enable them to make definite arrangements for the afternoon. The nursery will re-open at the usual time on the morning of Friday 2nd January 2009. We do not charge fees when the nursery is closed.

Pre-school parents

If your child is playing outside when you come to collect, please try to avoid walking through the Toddler unit because the stable door will be locked. Instead, could we ask that you collect your child using the gate nearest the 'vegetable patch' and then take them in through the front door to collect their belongings.

Reminders

- Winter is the way so please make sure your child has a warm outdoor coat along with a hat, gloves and a scarf. The children will play outside everyday unless it is raining.
- Please keep your child's pumpbag stocked with spare clothes, socks, underwear, etc. Staff will inform you if there is any dirty washing to take home. Please just take the dirty washing rather than the pumpbag itself.
- Please do not leave any plastic bags on your child's peg.
- To celebrate their child's birthday many parents like to bring in sweets or chocolates to give to the children in the unit. In line with our healthy eating policy could we suggest bringing in stickers instead.
