Welcome

We would like to welcome all new parents to the nursery. We hope your children enjoy their time with us and that you feel happy with the care they receive.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

All children, from the youngest babies to the eldest pre-school children follow the EYFS curriculum. This will become mandatory in all nurseries from September 2008. We introduced it in September 2007 so all our staff are already competent and confident with the new legislation

Pre-school unit

In addition to the EYFS, our pre-school children are introduced to Jolly Phonics and the Oxford Reading Tree. Jolly Phonics is a learning process for the alphabet and the sounds of the letters. Each letter has an action that helps children to remember the sound. Every time the sound is heard or the letter is seen, the action will be made and vice versa. With constant reinforcement along with fun activities the children should learn the sounds and letters with ease. The Oxford Reading Tree has always placed real emphasis on the part speaking and listening plays in early language development. Much-loved [Biff, Chip and Kipper](#) stories, and the supporting teaching material and activities all actively encourage talk. The pre-school staff benefit from the support and advice from Pam Axford, our fully qualified early years teacher who is based at our Tottington nursery.

Menu

The menu has been reviewed and the order of the meals has been changed so that children who attend nursery part time can try something new.

Nursery Education Funding

Children aged three and upwards are eligible for a government grant in the term after their third birthday. It is organised by the nursery. Those entitled to the grant in the Autumn Term will pay reduced fees for a period of 15 weeks starting on 01/09/08.
