Summer Charity Week - Yellow Theme

We have been raising money for charity since our first nursery opened in 1990. Over those 30 years, we have raised over £130,000 for more than 50 different charities! This year we will support two causes which are very close to our heart at Mulberry Bush. Firstly, we will support the Good Life Orphanage.

In 2008, we met Mary and Kevin Maguire who set up the Good Life Orphanage in Kenya. They had just been on holiday and they were overwhelmed by the poverty and desperate state of some of the children who were living on the streets near their hotel. This experience affected them so deeply that they took the life changing decision to buy some land and raise funds to build an orphanage which now cares for over 100 children. By 2012, Mary and Kevin had raised enough to build a school which provides food, medicine and education for over 350 children. The Good Life Orphanage is a non-profit organisation and every single penny raised goes directly to the project. Donations never go towards administration, travel or accommodation costs.

We were so impressed and humbled by the efforts of Kevin and Mary that we have supported them with our annual charity event every year since 2008. Each nursery also sends monthly financial support by sponsoring an orphaned child. Our children draw pictures and our team regularly send letters. We send presents on their 'house day' (this is the day they joined the orphanage, as many children were abandoned and wouldn't know their actual birthday) and we send Christmas presents. It's been a great tool to help explain to our children that there are others who are not as fortunate and how important it is to be kind whenever possible.

The second cause we would like to support is much closer to home.

Last December, a seven year old pupil called Teddy who attends one of our feeder schools, Holly Mount Primary, was involved in a very serious accident and suffered life changing injuries. He has been in hospital ever since, having battled through intensive care.

It is hoped he can come home in the next few months but he will need around the clock care and there will be many adjustments to the family home that will need to be put into place for that to happen. We know that you will want to support his family, it's a cause close to lots of us at nursery.

For your child/ren to take part in our Summer charity week please dress them in **YELLOW** and ask family and friends to simply make a donation towards these two amazing causes. The week will be extra special for the children with lots of great activities organised.

The aim of the scheme is to help make teeth brushing more fun and to increase the children's exposure to fluoride. We have been taking part in the scheme since 2018 and our Pre-School children continue to really enjoy taking part and we hope it has supported their tooth brushing at home.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework update

The EYFS framework is designed by the Department of Education and attempts to set the standards to make sure that children aged from birth to 5 learn and develop well and are kept healthy and safe.

The framework applies to all Ofsted registered early years providers in all settings, including nurseries, childminders, pre-schools and applies up to the end of reception at primary school.



The EYFS framework is changing from September 2021. The intention is to try to improve outcomes for children at age 5, particularly in early language and literacy.

Another of its aims is to try to reduce workload for early years practitioners, especially unnecessary paperwork, so team members can concentrate on the much more important job of spending time and building relationships with your children. We have been ahead of the game here, having reduced our own internal paperwork some years ago – however, we are currently working hard to update our internal paperwork to reflect these changes and will then take time to explain these changes to our team.

RoSPA – Take Action Today, Put Them Away!

Mulberry Bush is helping support The Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents launch a major programme to promote awareness and prevent accidents with household cleaning products.

Every year, thousands of infants need medical care for poisoning from products commonly found in and around the home. Most accidental poisoning happens to children younger than five years old, with children aged one to three years being most at risk. On average, 15 under-fives are admitted to hospital each day due to suspected poisoning from all sources. Admissions for poisoning across most of the North West of England, are significantly above the national average.

Mulberry Bush parents will be given a magnetic notepad to keep on your fridge with useful reminders to help avoid accidental poisoning in the home. Our nursery reception areas have further displays and information to provide really helpful tips.

Exploring is part of growing up but young children have little concept of potential dangers. They are inquisitive and often put things in their mouth to further explore their texture and taste. The kitchen and bathroom are the likeliest places for accidental poisonings from cleaning products.

Wherever possible buy products in child-resistant or child-safety packaging but be aware that these are not child proof. They simply delay the child from getting the product as quickly. It is still therefore important not to rely on child resistant packaging and to keep these products out of reach of children.

There are many other poisoning risks in the home such as medication, button batteries, alcohol, solvents, plants and garden products so please take some time to check your home is as safe as it can be.
